

ENDING HOMELESSNESS

- ♦ 100% of individuals and families in a homeless shelter and 95% in transitional housing, set goals to increase their income, go to work, and find resources to achieve more self-determination.
- ♦ 100% of the people in a homeless shelter, received hot nutritious meals. 40% were given clothing including job interview attire.
- ♦ 94% of youth discharged from a shelter for youth crisis were able to re-integrate into their community.
- ♦ 86% of residents in a homeless shelter moved into permanent housing.

SCHOOL READINESS FOR CHILDREN

- ♦ 100% of children in a preschool for low income families were screened for sensory, developmental, and behavioral delays so intervention can start early.
- ♦ 100% of youth in a drug prevention program, increased their social & leadership competency and built confidence to refuse alcohol, tobacco & other drugs by talking with peers about being drug free.
- ♦ 100% of 13,728 calls for help regarding family concerns like parenting, child care, and child development, received answers from a family resource center.
- ♦ 100% of high school students in a leadership program, became community involved, learned what leadership means, and saw state/local governments in action.
- ♦ 100% of 400 low incomes families were grateful to a family resource center for help with the cost of child care in order to remain employed.
- ♦ 43% of 2015 child neglect cases who were represented by a court advocate, ended with the child reuniting with their family or placed with a relative. 30% were adopted
- ♦ 95% of youth in an after-school program spent time doing their homework along with other interesting educational activities.
- ♦ 71% of youth matched with an adult mentor, showed a more positive attitude towards school with 70% improving their class participation according to reports from parents and teachers.

Community Impact

MEETING BASIC NEEDS

- ♦ 95% of callers to a community help line were listened to and received referrals for housing, food, a hot meal, rent assistance, emergency shelter, clothing, utility bills or gasoline.
- ♦ 100% of qualified food bank customers were given food to alleviate hunger.
- ♦ 100% of adults with a developmental disability needing assistance to live successfully in our community, got help to secure food, housing, clothing, medical services or help with money management through an advocacy program.
- ♦ 100% of learners who needed a drivers license to become more independent, passed their driver's test as a result of tutoring through a literacy center.
- ♦ 99% of 171 people with a disability seeking information from the local independent living center, had their questions answered or were referred to the resources they needed.

- ♦ 100% of people with a developmental disability in an advocacy program who need help with community living to keep them safe, received assistance.
- 100% of senior citizens receiving weekly grocery deliveries are able to stay in their own home.
- 100% of 1,546 MT taxpayers with low to moderate incomes in a tax assistance program, most of whom are age 60 or over, had their 2015 tax returns prepared for free.
- ♦ 100% of 720 people age 60 or older in a senior commodities program, have food delivered monthly by a local food bank.
